The ABRC ministers to over 500 elderly people who call one of the four campuses of care home. The centers offer a wide range of ministries to residents.		
The Baptist Foundation of Alabama		\$39.41
Foundation ministries and services are directed toward and realized for Alabama Baptists. The entire Baptist family benefits from Foundation ministries. Services include personal consultations, will conferences, estate planning, seminars, and materials.		
Christian Life Commission		\$7.29
The CLC helps inform and educate Alabama Baptists in matters relating to moral and ethical issues.		
Education Commission		\$0.99
This Commission represents the interests of Alabama Baptists and their relationship with the three institutions of Christian Higher Education.		
Historical Commission		\$38.08
As Great Commission Christians in a changing world, it is imperative that we work to preserve the record of God's constant faithfulness to Alabama Baptists. The Commission collects, protects, and promotes Baptist heritage.		
Shocco Springs		\$162.59
Shocco's purpose is to provide a beautiful conference center with quality accommodations designed to enhance the worship and learning experiences of guests. In an average year, over 45,000 people will attend and over 1,300 decisions for Christ are made.		
A. Earl Potts Scholarship		\$33.33
The Potts Scholarship provides \$750 to freshmen from Alabama Baptist churches enrolled at Samford, Judson, or Mobile who are preparing for full-time Christian service.		
Board of Aid to Students in Christian Vocations		\$105.63
Judson College		\$309.73
These funds help Judson College offer scholarships so women may receive a college education in a distinctively Christian environment.		
University of Mobile		\$783.92
These funds are used for scholarships to help University of Mobile offer students a college education in a distinctively Christian environment.		
ALCAP		\$19.54
ALCAP is an extension of the church on the cutting edge of moral concerns in schools and national, state, and local issues. ALCAP is not an entity of the Alabama Baptist State Convention, but does receive Cooperative Program funding.

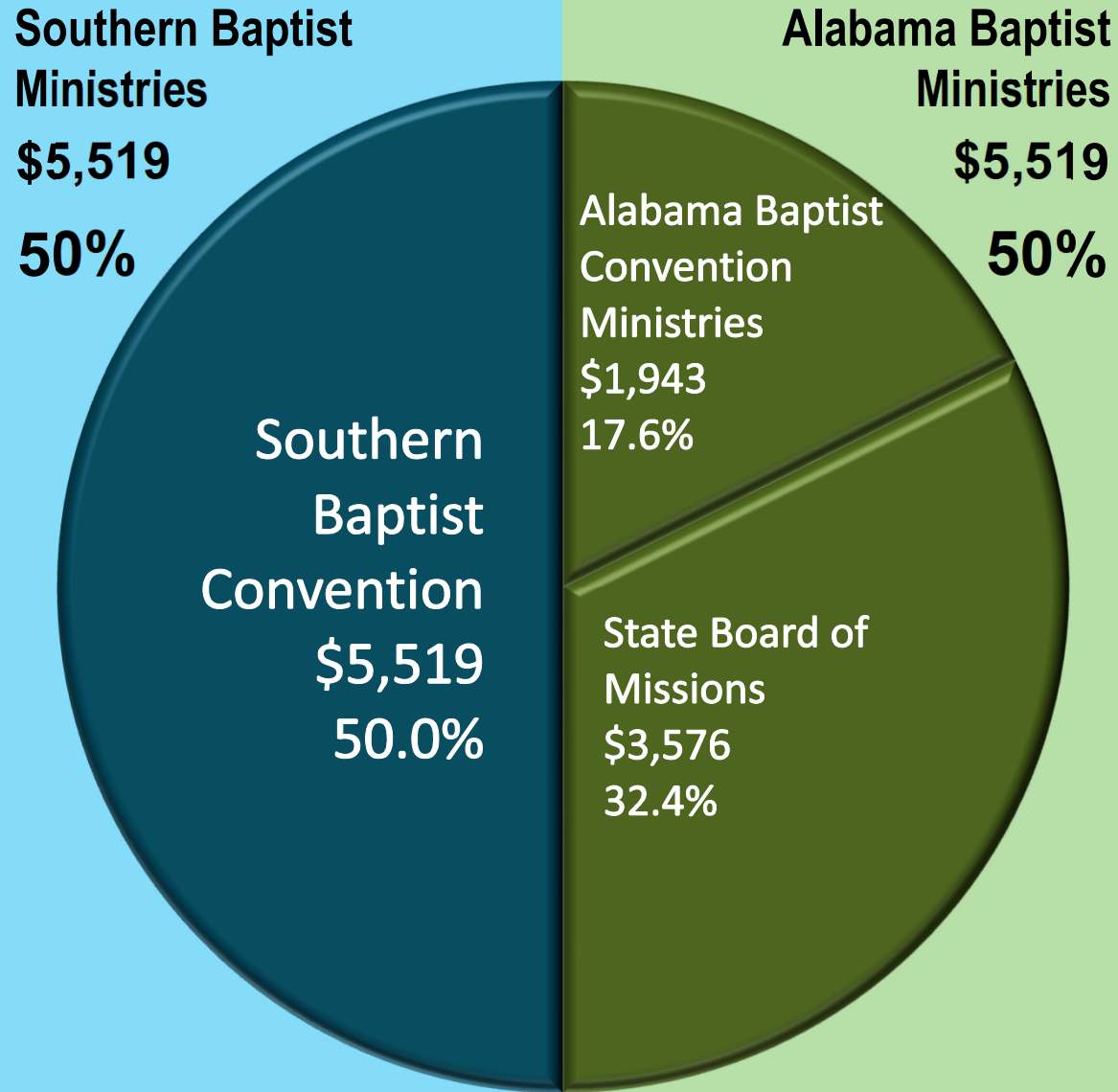

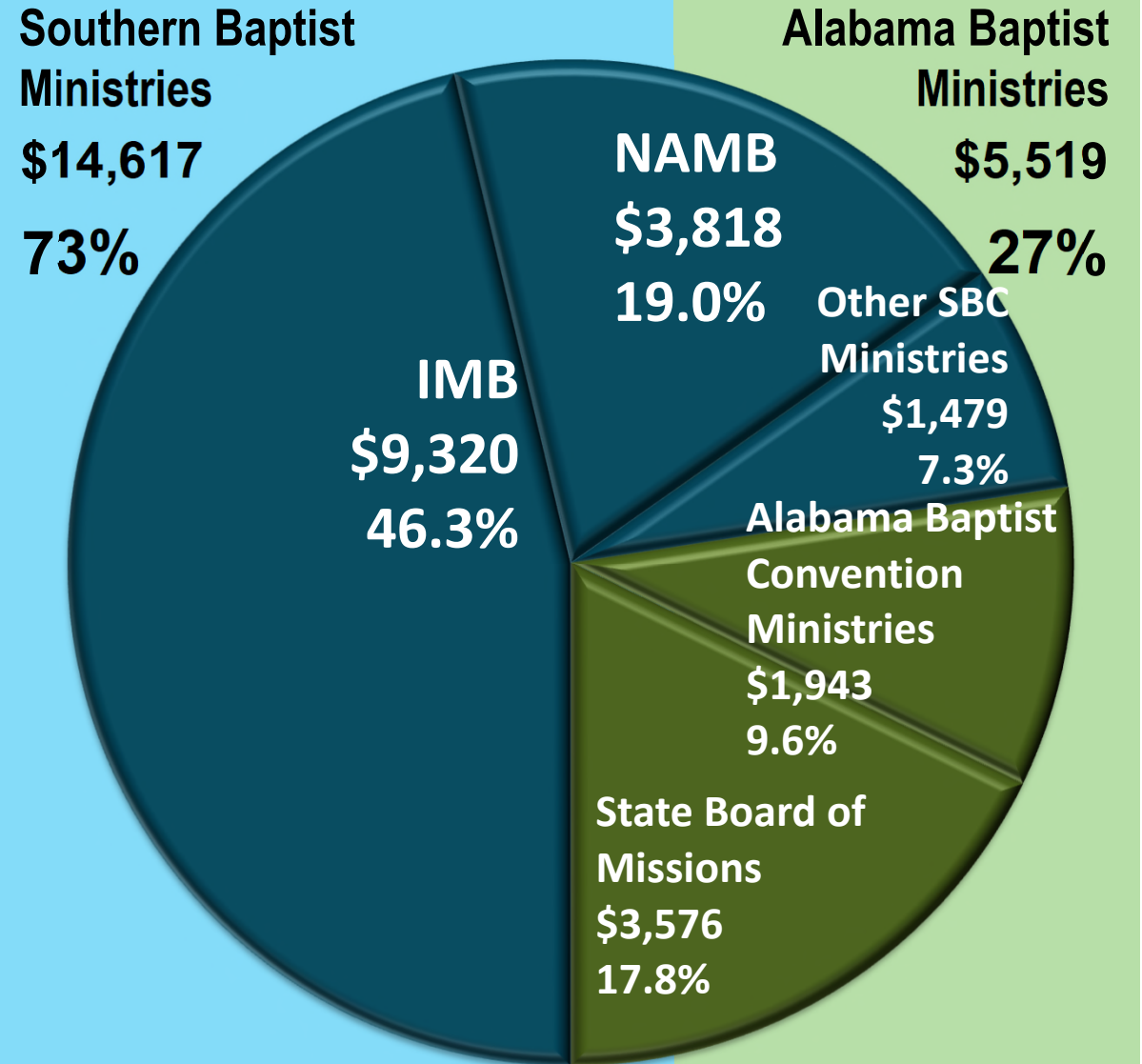
2019 Gifts Through the Cooperative Program ONLY
